

## **2022 POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT**

### **Introduction:**

On behalf of the Eaton Rapids Police Department, I am proud to present the 2022 Eaton Rapids Police Department Annual Report.

Throughout my thirty-five years in law enforcement if there has been one constant, its change. Law enforcement has continued to change and evolve. In many cases the change has been positive and necessary. Some, not so much. What's been most interesting recently is the speed at which law enforcement is changing. It's unlike anything I have seen in my career. The last several years has brought about legislative changes, such as legalization of marijuana, decriminalization of certain alcohol offenses and greater options for criminal history expungement. We have also seen cultural changes with very strong opinions, both pro and con towards law enforcement. These opinions are being vocalized and publicized almost daily through the various media forums. These cultural and legislative challenges have created enormous challenges to modern day policing.

Despite these challenges, ERPD is situated well for a great 2023. That's because in 2022- we had our own notable, yet positive changes. We were able to hire and implement a School Resource Office program, which started in April of 2022. Also, in late December, we filled our vacant detective position with a well-qualified and experienced detective from outside the officer's bargaining union. Neither of these changes would have been possible without strong relationships with our partners at Eaton Rapids Public Schools and the Capital City Labor Group, which represents the officers. We also hired our first Cadet that was able to successfully complete the police academy and become a licensed officer with the department.

This report will present to you an overview of department activity from the 2022 calendar year. It will include statistics, notable investigations, equipment information and training conducted, as some examples. Throughout the year officers did an excellent job of continuing to navigate the ongoing challenges in law enforcement. I am proud of their work and look forward to continued growth and development for us all.

With that said our team enjoys great support from the community and those we serve. It cannot be overstated enough how important that support is now and as we move forward. We strive every day to continue to earn that support.

## **2022 POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT**

### **Personnel and Equipment**

#### **Personnel**

Eaton Rapids Police Department is currently budgeted for ten and half police officers, to include a Chief, a Lieutenant, Detective and eight officers. One officer is a seasonal position funded by Eaton Rapids Public Schools. More on that later. We also have one full time Administrative Assistant and a volunteer Police Chaplain. We again struggled in 2022 with personnel not being able to reach full staffing at all in 2022. We, like many agencies, have struggled with staffing for the last several years. We lost three officers in late 2021 and one in 2022. Upon examining those losses, only one left for another police department in another part of the state due to family issue. The other two left police work all together.

Lieutenant Paul Creger completed his sixth year of service to the department in August of 2022. For those unfamiliar with the Lieutenant, he began working here in 2016. He had previously retired from Lansing Police Department as a detective. Lt. Creger served as our lead investigator for much of 2022. In addition, he supervises the departments firearms training, field training and other training programs along with his general supervision duties.

Administrative Assistance Kim Eddy's role has changed over the years and continues to change. Modernized systems like the transition to the states online pistol purchase program drive us farther away from using paper. Increased Freedom of Information Act requests for copies of officer's camera footage dominates a great deal of her time.

The officers here at ERPD are called upon to do more than many of their peers in large agencies. Such as performing duties like defensive tactics instructor, field training officer, crime scene investigator and others. The officer's willingness to volunteer to serve in these capacities is crucial to providing our community with a full-service law enforcement agency. I have noted these additional duties in the department roster listed below.

As previously mentioned, there were three notable personnel changes in 2022. First was the implementation of a seasonal position to serve as a School Resource Officer. We are extremely proud to be engaged in this partnership with the school. The district is reimbursing the city for the officer's wages, although the officer is an employee of the police department. The officer hired for this position is Jason Ferguson. SRO Ferguson retired from the Ingham County Sheriff's Office as their Chief Deputy. Feedback from school staff and students so far has been extremely positive.

The other change was the hiring of Ken Snyder in late December. Det Snyder is an experienced investigator once employed as a Lieutenant with Albion Department of Public Safety and recent Director of Albion College Campus Safety. Det. Snyder's current focus will be attending refresher trainings and working on cold or unsolved cases within the department.

Lastly, ERPD was able to hire Dillon Platte. Officer Platte was, to my knowledge, the departments first Cadet and successful police academy sponsorship candidate. Officer Platte completed Lansing Community College in December of 2022 and is currently in field training. Officer Platte is also a lifelong resident of Eaton Rapids and a local high school graduate.

### **Equipment/Software**

The Department currently has four marked patrol vehicles in its fleet. The marked units are all equipped with an in-car camera, internal microphone, rifle mount, emergency traffic lighting, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, ceramic rifle armor and assorted supplies. We also have a 2012 Chevrolet Impala that is utilized for administrative use, court and attending training. (It's important to note that the mileage reflected here is not a true indication of the wear on the vehicles when idle time is considered.) In 2022, we ordered a new 2023 Ford Police Utility-Hybrid to replace Car #22 for road patrol use. Due to manufacturing delays that vehicle has yet to arrive. Car #22 will be transitioned to an un-marked status to utilize for the detective and other administrative uses. Once the Impala starts to become a maintenance issue it will be sold.

The Ford Police Utilities work effectively for police patrol work. Their all-wheel drive is useful during Michigan winters and they provide valuable interior compartment space for all the gear officers carry now. The Michigan Municipal League is recommending vehicles be rotated out of normal patrol use after one hundred thousand miles.

Eaton Rapids Police Department lead the mid-Michigan region several years ago by being the first agency to purchase and deploy the Ford Utility Hybrid vehicles for law enforcement use. Since that time, we have received numerous inquiries about their operation and use in the field. There are a number of law enforcement agencies in the region now using these vehicles. Although they cost more than the standard gasoline model there is notable gas savings when the vehicle is operating in electric mode. Particularly during idle time.

The department currently owns ten, 9mm Glock model 17 pistols that were purchased in 2019. We also have five 5.56 caliber patrol rifles. We purchased one new one in 2022 to assure the day shift staff all had access to one. Two of the rifles purchased many years ago under an older military surplus program have been taken out of service and are to be sold to another agency once we can find a buyer. We also have three Tasers in use at the department. We upgraded the Tasers batteries and cartridges in 2021 and renewed all the certifications for our in-house instructor and staff. Due to expiring warranties, we will be looking to replace the Tasers in future budgets.

## **2022 Goals and Professional Development**

### **Goals**

The primary goal for several years is to stabilize our staffing levels. Headed into 2022 we had lost three officers and were woefully understaffed. As the year progressed our staffing situation changed dramatically as previously noted. Unfortunately, we lost Officer Richard Dover, an eleven-year veteran of the department. Internal assessments indicate factors, outside of department control, for most of the resignations. As we continue to head into 2023, we are positioning ourselves to be more proactive with our recruitment and marketing of the department in efforts to fill vacancies in this highly competitive and difficult market.

Lt. Creger has continued to work through the evidence room cleanup project which has been a multi-year project and goal. Despite his time committed to criminal investigations in recent years he was able to further this project. Dare I say complete the project. This has been a very tedious assignment as each piece of evidence must be physical identified, the case status reviewed, a criminal history on the offender run and often required a meeting with the prosecuting staff to determine the final disposition of each piece being evaluated. When Lt. Creger arrived ERPD still had evidence dating back to the eighties when the department was first formed that had not been properly disposed of. Aside from researching several firearms to determine if they can be seized or disposed of, the project is complete. The property room is running very efficiently. Det. Snyder is being trained on how to manage the room with the plan moving forward to turn that responsibility over to him.

### **Professional Development**

2022 brought about many more opportunities for training due to a more relaxed approached to previous years covid restrictions.

During 2022, except for isolated incidents, all officers received training on, emergency vehicle operations, active violence response, use of force, firearms, CPR/First Aid and legal update.

There were several specialized trainings that select officers attended. SRO Ferguson attended introductory training on School Resource Officer functions. Four officers attended advanced traffic stop training that involved simunitions and force on force experiences. Three officers participated in non-stranger sexual assault investigation training. Officer Briscoe attended a class titled "Leading without Rank." New personnel attended orientation training on radio operations through central dispatch. Lt.

Creger attended instructor training for Active Violence Response. Two officers attended a drug identification course. Three officers participated in the county wide active violence simulation at Grand Ledge Public Schools. Administrative Assistant Kim Eddy received training on the Freedom of Information Act.

Chief Weeks and Lt. Creger attended the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police conference and Chief Weeks attended the International Association of Chiefs of Police conference on behalf of and paid for by the MACP.

All the training described is in addition to policy and procedure updates and training or instruction that takes place as a matter of routine operations.

## **INVESTIGATIONS AND STATISTICS**

### **Statistics**

In 2022, Eaton Rapids Police Department received 2220 calls for service through the Eaton County Central Dispatch and 1595 self-initiated activities were called into dispatch for a total of 3862.

Michigan Incident Crime Reporting Data for 2022 is not published until the spring of 2023. However, I will be attaching 2021 data for reference.

Appendix B - Offense Count Report. This report, generated by ERPD, reflects incidents that rise to the level of requiring a written report due to legal or procedural reasons between 2018 and 2022. There are a few areas of note from this report.

First is file class 23005 Larceny – Theft from Motor Vehicle and 23006 Larceny – Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts. 2022 had a noted increase in both categories. Upon reviewing the theft from motor vehicle parts these are often crimes of opportunity. Our reports reflect vehicles being left unlocked overnight or property being left in the bed of trucks and easily accessible by criminals. Often a lack of evidence or clues at the scene make these crimes difficult to investigate. Currently ERPD has four cases awaiting charging decisions and four others were closed by arrest or juvenile referral.

Regarding theft of motor vehicle parts, we have experienced an uptick in thefts of catalytic converters from vehicles. This crime is often committed quickly under the cover of darkness using a saw to cut the part off from the vehicle.

13001 Non-Aggravated Assault. After a small decline in recent years, we saw a small increase in 2022. Most of these cases involve domestic violence and are either closed by arrest or at least referred for prosecution. These investigations can often be very dangerous to respond to and investigate. Domestic violence represents one of the most common crimes ERPD responds to and investigates. We are implementing a process for the detective to conduct next day follow up interviews with victims when the offender was arrested. The purpose is to collect any additional information or evidence on injuries or the treatment of those injuries to aid with prosecution of the offenders.

50000 Obstruction Justice is a classification most associated with warrant arrests. A cursory review of these cases suggests increased contact with individuals with arrest warrants during traffic contacts.

Eaton Rapids Police Department had a case closure rate of 54% in 2022.

### **Investigations**

Here is a list of notable investigations that were handled by ERPD personnel during 2022. Without a detective, each officer is responsible for investigating their own cases. Often, investigating the case involves cooperation with other agencies or with the assistance of the Lieutenant. This level of investigative responsibility and our closure rate in comparison to other agencies is an example of the excellent officers we have working at ERPD.

#### ***Murder/Suicide***

On October 26<sup>th</sup>, 2022, in the area of Kinneville Rd and Mike Simpson Dr, the evidence suggests that the suspect in this case intentionally hit a vehicle his wife was driving. After coming to a stop, he approached and shot her and then returned to his vehicle and shot himself. The suspect had been released on bond the previous week after being arrested for strangling her in Ingham County.

#### ***Felonious Assault***

On September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2022, two male suspects, with a history of grudges between the two, encountered each other on E Hamlin St near Main St. The suspect drew a pistol and pointed it at the other subject. A fight ensued. The victim was treated for injuries sustained from the fight. Officers obtained a confession from the suspect and seized the weapon involved. The suspect was charged with the crime and the case is pending disposition in the court system.

#### ***Domestic Violence***

On January 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022, an officer was dispatched to a Michigan St address regarding a domestic violence situation. Upon arrival he contacted the suspect. When the officer attempted to arrest the suspect, he became verbally irate. The officer drew his Taser, the subject went to his knees appearing to comply. Once the officer engaged to make the arrest the suspect stood up and grabbed the officers clothing in an apparent attempt to gain control of him. The officer was able to force the suspect to the ground & gain control and handcuff him. At the time of this incident backup was several miles away. The victim had reported being strangled by the suspect.

#### ***Vehicle Pursuit***

On June 17<sup>th</sup>, 2022, ERPD assisted Dewitt Township Police Department who had pursued a domestic violence suspect through Ingham County and into Eaton County. An ERPD officer successfully deployed stop sticks on Bellevue Hwy slowing the vehicle that eventually came to a stop. The officer assisted other officers on scene with locating and taking the suspect into custody.

#### ***Vehicle Pursuit***

On September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022, ERPD officers assisted Calhoun County Sheriff's Office and multiple other agencies with a pursuit that was initiated in Calhoun County. The suspect in the pursuit had reportedly fired a handgun at pursuing officers. The pursuit passed through town and ultimately ended just west of the city. No officers were injured, and the suspect was taken into custody without further incident.

### **INTERNAL INVESTIGATIONS AND USE OF FORCE**

#### **Internal Investigations**

It is the policy of the Eaton Rapids Police Department that formal complaints received shall be investigated. Maintaining the professional integrity of the department and the trust of the citizens of Eaton Rapids is of paramount importance. A periodic review of the complaints is conducted to assess for training needs and as a tool to further educate and enact corrective measures as necessary. To assure compliance with policy, this synopsis will show the origin of the complaint and the outcome of the investigation as designated by policy terminology. Of note, the citizen complaints listed are those that rise to the level of a formal complaint. It does not include routine contacts that are quickly resolved without the need for a full investigation.

It's worth noting that other than an incident involving an officer damaging a vehicle, the other sustained investigations were issues surrounding the timeliness of submitting work. The citizen generated courtesy issues were resolved upon investigation and review of the officer's body camera footage showing the officer conducting themselves in a polite and professional manner.

### **Use of Force**

The Eaton Rapids Police Department has a use of force policy that uses, as its foundation, language recommended by our insurer, the Michigan Municipal League. Per modern day law enforcement practices and our own department policy, use of force by officers requires them to submit a separate use of force report. These reports are individually reviewed for policy compliance and potential areas of training focus both individually and department wide.

In 2022, there were eighteen incidents that rose to the level of requiring a use of force report. This is an increase of one over 2021. Keep in mind, 25% of last year's incidents involved the same person, who is now incarcerated. This broad increase over last year is reflective of nationwide trends.

Reviewing the details of the incidents, six involved felony charges, seven involved misdemeanors, one involved an overdose, one involved a juvenile and two involved subjects who were Persons Requiring Treatment (mental disorder). The increase for the necessity for physical confrontations is of concern for the department. No link can be observed from the data available as to what has caused the increase.

No significant injuries were noted from these incidents and no complaints were filed with the department stemming from these uses of force. One officer has required treatment for an injured shoulder from a physical interaction with a subject resisting arrest.

### **EVENTS OR OTHER NOTABLE ACTIVITIES**

During 2022 it was brought to our attention that a former patrol officer for the City of Eaton Rapids, George "Tom" Emery (65) had died in the line of duty while trying to break up a fight in the Alley behind Abies Bar. Due to the circumstances of that incident, Officer Emery's name was eligible to be placed on the Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Wall in Washington D.C. Lt. Paul Creger traveled to D.C. in May of 2022 and represented our department at the annual Law Enforcement Memorial Event.

Officers Briscoe and Quimby represented ERPD at the annual Shop with a Hero Event in Charlotte.

SRO Ferguson initiated a shoe donation program in which Playmakers donated approximately one hundred slightly used or unsold shoes to the department to be gifted to students in need. This was a project he had done at his previous position and utilized those connections to jump start it here.

Lt. Creger performed an online gun safety training for a state representative and a group of self-identified pacific islanders over zoom. This was in response to a request made to the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police by the state representative.

During the second half of 2022, Chief Weeks traveled to several communities throughout the state on behalf of the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police to present department accreditation awards to agency heads before their governing bodies.

City Council recognized Lt. Paul Creger and former Officer Richard Dover in 2022 for their actions involving a domestic violence incident in December of 2021. The female victim in that incident had been shot. Officer Dover and Lt. Creger's quick actions that day played a significant role in assuring the victims safety and minimizing the potential seriousness of her wound.
