INTRODUCTION

On behalf of all members of the Eaton Rapids Police Department, I am proud to present the 2025 Eaton Rapids Police Department Annual Report.

As a police department, we made significant strides in stabilizing service levels following 2024. After completing field training with new officers in 2024 and an additional new hire in 2025 we have established an excellent group of ten dedicated professionals that are currently serving within the police department.

We continue to strive to recruit high-quality candidates for our remaining two open positions. In 2025, we reprised the position of Patrol Sergeant. There are growing responsibilities related to maintaining accreditation and more importantly, the need to have a motivated frontline supervisor mentoring and leading our patrol staff. When speaking with former employees, this is an area that is often pointed to as a shortcoming that needs to be filled.

Speaking of accreditation, we made notable advancements towards completing the process with the Michigan Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission. Lt. Creger has been leading us with researching and writing policy, collecting proofs of compliance and working with me to ensure department operations are consistent with accreditation standards. All this work continues to enhance our professionalism and overall accountability as a department.

Overall, statistically crime and arrests are down from previous years. Since 2023, total arrests have gone down from 193 to 161. Reports of larcenies and malicious destruction of property incidents also hit five-year lows. However, fraud cases continue to tick up. With criminals using consistently improving technology, it has become increasingly complex to investigate and pursue these cases.

There was a notable increase in traffic crashes from last year's historic lows. Increasing from 71 total crashes in 2024 to 102 in 2025. The 2025-year rate is consistent with historical averages, yet disappointing considering an increase in traffic enforcement.

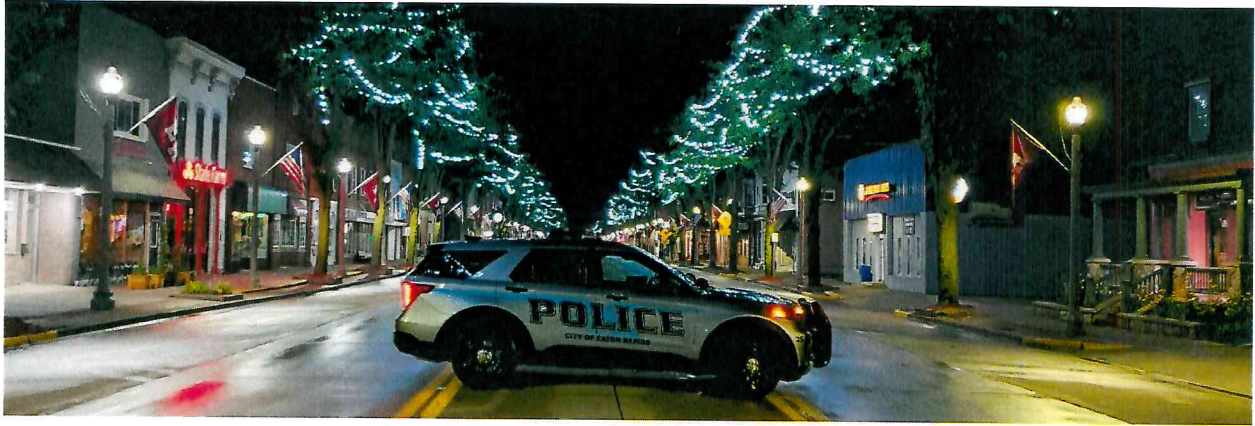

Equipment/Software

The Department currently has four marked patrol vehicles in its fleet. The marked units are all equipped with in-car cameras, internal microphones, rifle mount, emergency traffic lighting, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, ceramic rifle armor and other assorted supplies. We encountered notable mechanical challenges in 2025 with some of our vehicles. Car #22 required a new, used transmission. Car #25 required body work due to a minor crash and car’s #25 and #24 have had an increase in electrical issues related to their hybrid capabilities.

ERPD purchased an unmarked used 2020 Kia Sportage for \$1200.00 from a tow company. The vehicle is being used for administrative duties, training and court appearances.

In 2025 ERPD, with council approval, replaced all its duty handguns. Upgrading to Glock Model 45, with Aimpoint Optics. Transition training took place in December. Based on Lt. Creger's assessment, there was an observed increase in accuracy by officers over our previous weapons.

2025 Goals and Professional Development

Goals

In 2023, the Eaton Rapids Police Department applied for accreditation with the Michigan Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission. Due to staffing challenges since then we are behind schedule for completion. In 2025 we asked for and were granted a six-month extension, giving us until July of 2026 to complete the process. An assessment of our status has us on track to complete by then.

The Eaton Rapids Public Safety Building is more than twenty years old. There are aspects of the building such as heating and cooling, pedestrian doors and door handles, shower facilities and the parking lot that require maintenance or upgrades due to deterioration. I look forward to continuing to work with City Council to determine future funding solutions to resolve these maintenance challenges.

In 2024 we noted our plan to research the implementation of a drone program for use with the department and possibly with other city departments. Drones have been used now in law enforcement for several years and have been a very effective tool. They can be deployed in cases of missing people, fleeing suspects, traffic crashes and natural disasters. They can also be used as eyes in very dangerous situations in place of an officer. The Drone program can also be used as a recruiting and retention tool to provide opportunities for officers to expand their skills. We have completed our research and are moving forward with seeking funding and exploring purchase options and implementation.

Training and Professional Development

In 2024 the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards, with funding support from the Michigan legislature, implemented a pilot program for continuing professional education (CPE). Police agencies in Michigan are allotted \$1000 per full-time equivalent to train officers in pre-established categories. CPE requirements will be mandated in the future to maintain licensure as a police officer in the state. In 2025 officers were required to have twenty-four hours of training in categories generally falling under the topic of Mental Health Crises, to include autism awareness, legal update, subject control and patrol procedures.

ERPD utilizes a variety of sources to provide the necessary level of quality and breadth of training necessary for our officers to perform at a high level of competency. One of the sources we utilize is an online training platform called Virtual Academy. The CPE requirements for 2025 were met by utilizing this service. We are also members of the Southern Michigan Criminal Justice Training Consortium. The Consortium is a collaborative partnership among approximately twenty-seven law enforcement agencies in southern Michigan. Through this partnership we share law enforcement distribution funds, instructors, and other resources to work collaboratively to present training that many of us could not do alone. As the CPE requirements grow more stringent that partnership will increase in value. The final, and quite possibly

most important resource is our own staff. The ability of some ERPD staff members to present advanced training to other members of ERPD is extremely valuable. Most notably, Officer Briscoe's background in defensive tactics and Lt. Creger's skills in firearms.

Not only did we meet the required continuing professional education hours required, which was twenty-four, we exceeded the minimum. Officers trained in Emergency Vehicle Operations, Speed Measurement Enforcement, Interviewing and cybercrime as an example of some of the training received.

Some specialized areas of training received by ERPD members in 2025 included technological threats against law enforcement, Active Violence Response, Evaluating Use of Force.

Chief Weeks is a member of the Law Enforcement Action Forum. This is a group of law enforcement executives from around the state, selected by the cities insurance provider to review and implement recommended policies on behalf of the provider for their law enforcement customers. Twice a year, the group meets for two days to review policy and receive training on high liability areas.

Chief Weeks continues his participation in the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police and its training conferences. These conferences ensure continued information on the ever training landscape of our profession.

INVESTIGATIONS, FLOCK CAMERAS AND STATISTICS

Statistics

In 2025, Eaton Rapids Police Department received 2009 calls for service, and 1919 self-initiated activities were called into dispatch for a total of 3991 incidents.

Appendix A - Offense History Report. This report, generated by ERPD, reflects incidents that rise to the level of requiring a written report due to legal or procedural reasons between 2015 and 2025.

Of note from the report, after historic lows last year in non-aggravated assaults, the numbers this year more accurately reflect historical norms.

There have been notable increases in two categories: 35003 Narcotic Equipment and 54002 Operating While Intoxicated. The increase in narcotic equipment is mostly attributed to the amount of THC vaping devices recovered by our School Resource Officer or school staff. The increase

The increase in operating while intoxicated is attributed to the increase in traffic stops over the previous year leading to higher rates of intoxicated drivers being discovered.

Investigations

There were two incidents from 2025 that are noteworthy.

On January 29th, 2025, two officers responded to a call of illegal burning. Upon contacting the suspect, he started a chainsaw and lunged at them. He then fled and barricaded himself into his bedroom inside his home. The suspect was taken into custody without incident and was later prosecuted.

On December 30th, 2025, an officer attempted to stop a vehicle leaving the scene of a house commonly associated with drug trafficking. The vehicle fled and crashed. The encounter led to a fatal shooting that is still under the investigation by the Michigan State Police.

Flock Camera System

The Flock Camera system is a series of four cameras strategically placed around the city to enhance our investigative abilities for unsolved cases or locating wanted or stolen vehicles that travel through town on Main St.

The cameras were searched approximately thirty times for investigations, in addition to other alerts from the devices. There are two cases we would like to highlight. First was it was used in locating a wanted felony suspect who was wanted for domestic violence and strangulation of his girlfriend. The system alerted an officer to the vehicle. The officer was able to search the area further and locate the suspect and arrest him.

In April of 2025, a camera alerted an officer to a missing person driving through the city. The subject was elderly and suffering from dementia. The vehicle and subject were located and returned to their family shaken, but unharmed.

INTERNAL INVESTIGATIONS AND USE OF FORCE

Internal Investigations

It is the policy of the Eaton Rapids Police Department that all complaints of officer misconduct received shall be investigated. Maintaining the professional integrity of the department and the trust of the citizens of Eaton Rapids is of paramount importance. An annual review of the complaints is conducted to assess training needs and as a tool to further educate and enact corrective measures as necessary. To assure compliance with policy, this synopsis will show the origin of the complaint and the outcome of the investigation as designated by policy terminology.

In 2025, the Eaton Rapids Police Department again saw a decrease in internal investigations with three being citizen-initiated complaints. There were 11 investigations in 2025 and thirteen in 2024.

Your department leadership continues to actively review the work of its officers and the treatment of the citizens the officers have contact with to continue to ensure that officers are doing a thorough job explaining law enforcement activities and treating citizens in the professional manner they have come to expect.

Use of Force

The Eaton Rapids Police Department has a use of force policy that uses, as its foundation, the constitution, language recommended by our insurer, the Michigan Municipal League, federal case law and accreditation standards. Per our policy, use of force by officers requires them to submit a separate use of force report. These reports are individually reviewed for policy compliance and potential areas of training focus or policy improvement, both individually and departmentally.

Officers filed fifteen Use of Force Reports in 2025 which is a slight increase from last year when officers filed thirteen reports. Of these reports, ten involved subjects who were under the influence of either alcohol or controlled substances. Eight involved assaultive behavior prior to the officers responding. Two involved incidents where the accused attempted to flee in a vehicle prior to being arrested.

Almost all of the incidents where there was a Use of Force involved Felony crimes including Felony Resisting, all others involved Misdemeanors where the accused was under the influence at the time force was used. Two Taser deployments occurred, but neither was effective. In several incidents, firearms were displayed or held at the low ready based on the crimes that officers responded to. In two of the cases, officers were assisting another department responding to incidents involving felony crimes. As of the writing of this report, no complaints have been filed related to use of force.

At the end of this year, officers were in a situation where Deadly Force was utilized and the accused subject is deceased. At the time of this report, that incident is still under investigation, both from a criminal and internal standpoint. None of the other incidents involved any injuries to either the subject or officer.

Aside from the pending investigation, the other incidents reflect that the actions of Eaton Rapids Police Officers continue to be professional, restrained, within department policy and in line with contemporary law enforcement standards.

The annual report is designed to inform and educate the administrative members of the Eaton Rapids Public Schools and the City of Eaton Rapids about the activities, influence, and impact of the district's School Resource Officer during the 2024-2025 school year. This report will identify law enforcement related statistics as well as narrate the proactive strategies being employed to engage and assist the student body.



SRO Jason Ferguson / Biography and Training

SRO Ferguson is a graduate of Mason High School, Lansing Community College, and Slena Heights University with an Associates Degree in Criminal Justice and a Bachelor's Degree in Public Safety Administration. He is currently working in his 33rd year as a law enforcement officer. SRO Ferguson retired from the Ingham County Sheriff's Office in January 2021. After retiring, he was employed as a full-time substitute teacher with ERPS before accepting the SRO position.

To best integrate him into the school environment, SRO Ferguson has successfully completed the following school related training

- 5 Day Conference: Schools Educators Police Liaison Association
- 1 Day Class: Investigating Social Media Threats
- 1 Day Class: Autism - Interaction & De-escalation
- 3 Day Class: Forensic Interviewing Seminar
- 1 Day Class: Understanding and Planning for School Bombings

In June 2023, SRO Ferguson attended the 5-day National Association of School Resource Officers Conference and became nationally certified.



Duties and Responsibilities of the SRO

The primary objective of having a police presence in the schools is to protect life and property. The Eaton Rapids Police Department, through the SRO, is committed to protect the safety of the public and their rights to conduct lawful activities on school property.

The SRO is responsible for the prevention of crime as well as the appropriate application of law when unlawful actions or activities occur with students, staff, or visitors to the Eaton Rapids Public Schools. This effort is accomplished in direct collaboration with school building administrators on a daily basis.

The SRO is also required to engage students as a mentor and be a resource for their education, development, behavior, and to help navigate challenging or difficult times in their day. While the SRO does not directly enforce school policies or rules, he or she is expected to cultivate relationships with students that build trust and create positive influences. This manner of interaction leads to mutually rewarding connections while promoting respect between students and law enforcement personnel
